
Since 2020, AWBW has experienced <u>unprecedented</u> growth!



Scholarship Impact

Linus Ngha Beng Kwokom also known as <u>Bobo Leennox</u>

International Scholarship Recipient

Community Youth Arts Center COYAC Founder and Coordinator, *Cameroon*

Linus established the Community Youth Arts Center (COYAC) in 2003 with a mission to empower young people through the arts. Recognizing the transformative potential of creative expression, Linus opened COYAC's doors to children and youth, providing a sanctuary for self-expression and skill development. His dedication led him to offer training in visual and performing arts, bridging educational gaps for those unable to attend school regularly.

The outbreak of the Anglophone Crisis in Cameroon in 2016 disrupted the lives of many children and families, forcing them to flee and become refugees or internally displaced persons. Despite the challenges, Linus remains committed to empowering youth through arts and creativity.

After attending AWBW's Facilitator training, Linus continues to promote equity, inclusivity, and unity in diverse cultural expression.

Because we lack the financial means, we desperately need AWBW and it's funders to use arts in transforming communities, impacting lives, giving hope to marginalised children and youth and making the world a better place.

Karen Luis Barrondo

2023 Helmstetter Family Foundation Training Scholarship Recipient

Case Manager at CARECEN - Deportation Defense Unit, Los Angeles, CA

In supporting unaccompanied children facing immigration challenges and trauma, Karen, a dedicated Windows Facilitator, deeply influenced one child who struggled after losing their father. Karen used various activities to aid healing and strengthen their bond, including *Creando un Espacio Seguro/Valiente* (Creating A Safe/ Brave Place).

By guiding the child to visualize their safe place, she empowered them to find solace in their new family. Witnessing the child's resilience, Karen emphasized carrying their Safe/Brave place within, offering comfort in uncertainty. Her commitment highlights the impact of our team's work with these resilient youth.

> Everyone has something or does something that makes them feel safe, but for children, it can be difficult to identify that until someone points it out, as I did for this child.

Investing in Education-Based Mental Health



Through our collaboration with AVANZA, a community-based organization serving students and families within the Lennox School District, together we've created a tailored resource hub for educators, featuring an art activity workbook, Facilitator guide, and video of an AWBW staff member leading an art workshop with students. These tools empower educators to engage unhoused students through art, addressing their unique needs and fostering self-expression and resilience.

The workbook offers structured art activities aimed at fostering healing within the vulnerable population of unhoused students. With step-by-step instructions and best practices, the Facilitator guide helps educators feel confident in leading meaningful sessions that support students' emotional exploration.

Donor Highlight



The Helmstetter Family Foundation

Through the compassionate and forward-thinking contributions of the Helmstetter family, vital support has been channeled into shaping young lives through the creation of the Jeaninne Helmstetter Legacy Scholarship.

Christi Helmstetter and her oldest daughter, Alicia, discovered A Window Between Worlds through National Charity League, a mother-daughter philanthropy organization. While volunteering together creating sample art, they noticed the positive benefits on their own well-being which demonstrated how powerful these tools could be to help those dealing with trauma.

Our hope is that this scholarship will remove a financial obstacle to training one more youth Facilitator each year and, over time, create a ripple effect that will lead to the next generation being better equipped to take over and with better mental health than the prior generation.

Their involvement soon grew to include financial support through the Helmstetter Family Foundation, focused on helping disadvantaged youth, which has continued even as management of the foundation has passed on to the next generation. Christi's late mother-in-law, Jeaninne, was the driving force behind the foundation, so it felt like a natural fit to establish a scholarship in her honor for Facilitators serving youth.

They feel that, as a society, we will always be looking to children to take over in the future. We should give children every tool possible to succeed and skills to maintain mental health are a crucial part of that. That is definitely an investment worth making!
