


Build pathways for participants and Facilitators to co-innovate through sector landing pages, self-recording tools, and a revised interactive Facilitator dashboard.


Our Largest Event Yet!

Rooted in Resilience Project

AWBW is dedicated to investing in individual sectors and expanding access to trauma-informed art workshops.

- A Strong Partnership: We found a key partner in Just Detention International (JDI) to support currently and formerly incarcerated survivors of trauma.
- <u>Training for Change</u>: Over three years, we will train 30 survivor service providers, equipping them with tools to foster healing in their communities.
- <u>Sustainable Growth</u>: Through structured training, mentorship, and ongoing support, Facilitators are bringing lasting art programs in detention and reentry settings.
- Amplifying the Work: To support all Facilitators serving incarcerated populations, we're creating facilitator guides, recorded discussions, and conference presentations to share best practices and inspire broader adoption.
- Looking Ahead: As we enter our second year of partnership, we're excited to deepen this work and collaborate with JDI to further strengthen this sector.






Revenue




